Safer Colchester Partnership

Host a Community Day of Action in your area!

Community groups across the borough now have the opportunity to plan and host a Community Day of Action to tackle issues of local concern. This revitalised plan builds upon the success of The Safer Colchester Partnership's Community Day of Action program that has taken place across Colchester over the last seven years.

A Community Day of Action is a high impact, multi-agency event that can include extensive clean-up campaigns, community & youth engagement, enforcement operations and other projects that can help to improve the quality of life for local residents.

To apply there is a simple new application process that enables any community member or representative in the borough to make a difference to their area with the support of a willing group of people.

In order to make a successful application your group will be required to explain the issues that need to be addressed within your community, the details of your community group and volunteers along with a legacy that will remain following the Day of Action.

All applications will be reviewed by a panel of authorities from the Safer Colchester Partnership.

The winning community will then be announced and with the support of partnership a toolkit will be provided to assist with the planning and delivery of the Day of Action.
