

These photos were taken last week of a short stretch of hedge along Straight Road. There were 5 separate bags thrown there altogether.

This is the reply from Andy Williams at the CBC's Community Services:

The problem with people not clearing up after their dogs is one that we face across the Borough. I give this advice out quite regularly but unfortunately I do not have a magic wand to instantly cure the problem.

Me and my staff of two Wardens cover a large area including St Johns, Mile End, Highwoods, Dedham, Langham, Boxted, West Bergholt and Eight Ash Green to name only some of the areas. I promise you that we do take this matter seriously and CBC is currently involved in a Keep Britain Tidy project aimed specifically at preventing dog mess. In regard to what dog owners should do if they do not want to carry a full poo bag around, I would tell them to be more responsible. If they want to have a dog then

they have a duty to clear up after it. They certainly should not be throwing the bags away and leaving them for somebody else to clear up. Colchester is very well served with both dog and litter bins, we cannot put them every few yards all over the Borough.

If you can provide me with the names and / or addresses then I will arrange for a Warden to call at the property concerned with a view to providing the education that would hopefully put an end to the problem. Other than that, I think that the best option is for members of the public to speak to offenders about clearing up after their dog as long as they are confident about doing so and do not put themselves at risk.

Litter bins can also be used to dispose of dog waste. I am reluctant to simply put another bin as we currently have a large number across the zone and the cost is very restrictive. It is better to change offenders behaviour rather than to try and install bins every 50 yards across the Borough.

I hope that this email is of some reassurance to you, but I do wish that I had that magic wand to cure this disgusting problem.
